Ohio's department of Medicaid has submitted to CMS a plan for ARPA funds to be used for various forms of provider relief across all Medicaid funded systems. Proposed Ohio HB 43 contains a provision whereby members of "volunteer" public boards that do not have nay "taxing power" would be able to participate remotely in up to 50% of a board's meetings, as long as at least 1/3 of the board's members were physically present at a meeting. The writer of the letter that was read at December's board meeting has been contacted and assured of the board's support for the individual. Arrangements are being made for a presentation at February's board meeting regarding the intake and eligibility process for county board services. A presentation will be arranged for a subsequent board meeting regarding the process used for waiver determination and the waiver "wait list". ## **Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 5126.01**

Developmental disability means a severe, chronic disability that is characterized by all of the following

1. It is attributable to a mental or physical impairment or a combination of mental and physical impairments, other than a mental or physical impairment solely caused by mental illness as defined

in Division (A) of Section 5122.01 of the Revised Code

2. It is manifested before age 22

3. It is likely to continue indefinitely

4. It results in one of the following

- In the case of a person under age 3, at least one developmental delay or an established risk;

- (b) In the case of a person at least 3 but under age 6, at least two developmental delays or an established risk

- In the case of a person age 6 or older, a substantial functional limitation in at least three of the following areas of major life activity, Self-Care, Receptive and Expressive language, Learning, Mobility, Self-Direction, Capacity for Independent Living, and, if the person is at least age 16, Economic Self-Sufficiency

5. It causes the person to need a combination and sequence of special, interdisciplinary, or other

type of care, treatment or provision of services for an extended period of time that is individually

planned and coordinated for the person



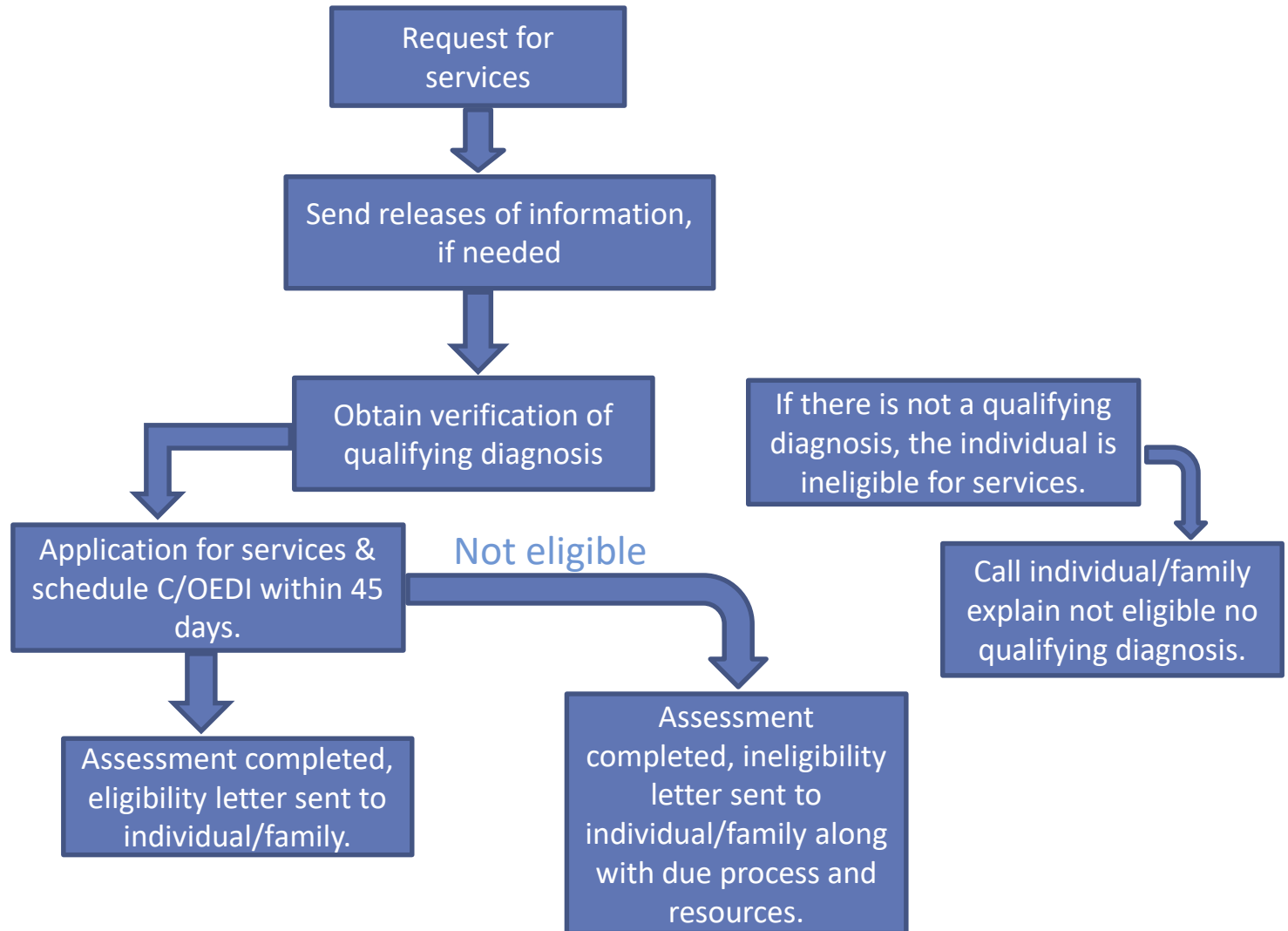

# Acceptable diagnoses made by a qualified professional\* include, but are not limited to:

AIDS, Amputation, Aphasia or Dysphasia, Asperger's Disorder, Attention Deficit Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Autism, Cancer, Cerebral Palsy, Circulatory Conditions, Clubfoot, Cystic Fibrosis, Down Syndrome, Epilepsy or Seizure Disorder, Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD), Hemiparesis, Hemophilia, Huntington's, Hydrocephalus, Juvenile Arthritis, Learning Disability, Lesh-Nyhan, Lung Disease, Developmental Disability (specify level), Muscular Dystrophy, Nonverbal Learning Disability, Osteogenesis Imperfecta, Pervasive Developmental Disorder, Prader-Willi, Rett's Syndrome, Severe Cardiac Conditions, Sickle Cell Anemia, Speech-Language Disorders (Aphasia, Dysphasia, Dysfluency, Expressive Language Disorder, Mixed Receptive-Expressive Language Disorder, Phonological Disorder and Stuttering), Spina Bifida, Spinal Cord Injury, Stroke, Tourette's Syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injury, Tuberosus Sclerosis, Usher's Syndrome, or other degenerative or neurological conditions often associated with a developmental disability.

SSA's are stepping out .... well not on the ice rink but they are getting out and about in order to learn more about those they support and future possibilities! Cameron plays on a 10U hockey league with the Dayton Stealth. He plays goaltender, and also skates out. Cameron learned to skate at 6 years old, at his grandfather's skating rink in Cincinnati. He quickly grew in skill and confidence on the rink, and soon joined the Cincinnati Cyclones Special Hockey Program. This is where he met his mentor, Alex Hill, a senior, and the goaltender for St. Xavier High School. Alex worked with Cameron in Cincinnati regularly, and developed a friendship and mentorship with Cameron. Alex shared his knowledge of skating, hockey and teamwork, but also took a personal interest in Cameron, and continues to work with him to this day. When Cameron turned 8, he joined the Dayton Stealth, a hockey league that plays other teams from Cincinnati, Columbus & West Virginia.



Cameron's parents, Destiny and Mike Bessery, who have 3 other children with disabilities (one very severe), have supported Cameron by providing him with rollerblades, sticks and nets at home, and even turning their fireplace into a hockey goal for Cameron. They have also enrolled him in several hockey camps, and have attended all of his practices and games, no matter the distance. Cameron's grandparents, from Cincinnati, and Pennsylvania, have also supported him by helping with the cost of equipment and travel, and attending his games.

Cameron has Autism, and a speech delay. He is small in stature, and was extremely shy and quiet, when he began hockey. In the beginning, he would not make eye contact with others, and would not speak. He also had great difficulty being in close proximity to others, and had a very difficult time tolerating being touched by his teammates or coaches. Team sports have taught him how to interact with others on his team, and how to be part of a group. The skills and focus he has developed, have helped him both socially and academically, and have greatly increased his level of self-confidence. Cameron became fearless on the rink, until he was injured last year during a hockey camp. He was apprehensive and fearful after his injury, but with the support of his coach, Alex, and his family, Cameron has overcome his fear, and has resumed playing with confidence.

Cameron's story shows how finding one positive thing that a child is drawn to, and providing the supports needed for them to succeed, can have such a huge impact on all areas of the child's life. Thanks Valerie French for an inspirational story.

**Madison is currently enrolled in our program and on Joe Cotner's case load. Madison is 13 years old and started her modeling career when she was just 8 years old, at the state beauty pageant where she was offered her first modeling gig. Since then she has won the Miss Teen Ohio Pageant and other awards such as Miss Infinity International. Through being Miss Teen Ohio, Madison was invited to New York Fashion Week and had the opportunity to walk the runway**



for 2 different designers. Madison continues to model and work with her modeling coach to improve her modeling skills. In April she will be passing along her title as Miss Teen Ohio but will continue to model and is having a lot of fun.

Our little fellow's family requested an exit waiver as he has been living in an ICF in Dayton since his release from Dayton Children's Hospital. Being just 2 years old and having only lived in the facility was hard on the family and the one dream the grandparents had was to get him home. That dream was finally met with reality when he made his way on January 25<sup>th</sup>. The grandparents took every test, training, meeting, and appointment needed to ensure they were ready and had all the knowledge of the care he would need to welcome him home.

With this he needed an SSA to write his plan and monitor services. Renae worked diligently to make sure his needs were addressed and services could begin. Thank you Renae for all of your work and time put into helping this family.

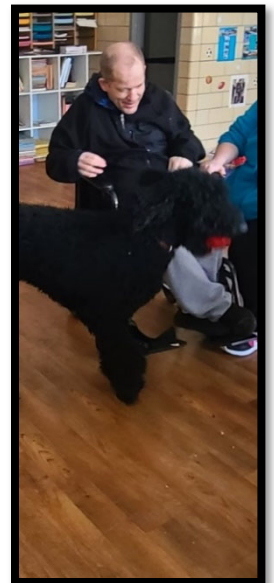
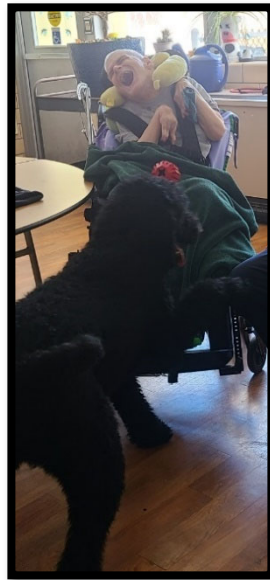
