## EARLY INTERVENTION

- Early Intervention is part of the Early Childhood department of Developmental Disabilities of Clark County.
- We provide services for children from birth through two years of age.
- Our commitment is to provide quality services for your child and family. We partner with you to promote your child's participation in daily activities. Parent involvement is crucial in all aspects of the child's success.

## WE ARE EXPERTS

Our team is made up of service coordinators, developmental specialists, a speech pathologist, a physical therapist, and an occupational therapist. Each team member has training and experience working with children who have a variety of needs, including hearing and vision loss, Autism, language delays, Down syndrome, limited mobility and more. We will help build your family's capacity to care

for your child and promote his/her growth and development in natural environments.

Early Intervention is funded by the Developmental Disabilities of Clark County levy and State grant funds.

## WHAT TO EXPECT

Once your child has been referred to our program, he/she will be assigned a Service Coordinator who will guide you through the process, arrange evaluations, services, and meetings. Your child will also be assigned a Developmental Specialist (DS) who will complete an assessment of your child to determine needs and outcomes. Your DS will provide personalized coaching in your child's natural environment, (home, day-care, community, etc.) to help your child reach his/her full potential.

## ELIGIBILITY

Children age birth through 2 are eligible for services if they have a:

- diagnosed disability
- physical or mental condition with a high probability of resulting in a delay

Or a delay in one of the following areas:

- Large Muscle Movement (rolling, crawling, walking)
- Small Muscle Movement (holding a bottle, rattle, toys)
- Speech and Language Skills (feeding, understanding others, saying words)



To arrange an eligibility assessment for your child age 0-2, call Early Intervention at (937) 328-2680.

Our program is highly effective, with about 50% of the children receiving our services no longer needing them upon entering preschool.
