SUPPORTIVE SERVICES



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

F.F. MUELLER CENTER

The F.F. Mueller Residential Center is a State licensed and Department of Health-Certified Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) providing 24/7 nursing care and active treatment. Our goal is to help each individual reach his/her fullest potential and be recognized as an integral member of the community.

The Center serves adults, many of whom are medically fragile, need behavioral support, or who would otherwise need nursing home care. We provide multi-disciplinary services, including occupational therapy, psychological and psychiatric consultation, medical monitoring, pharmacological/lab support, and dietary support.

Our 17.5-acre park-like campus includes two co-ed living units, an Activity Center, outdoor recreational areas, and a walking path.

INDIVIDUAL SERVICES

The needs of residents are addressed annually in an Individual Plan (IP). The IP focuses on each individual's strengths and desires, forming the foundation to support them in becoming as independent as possible.


Individuals participate in activities that support and enhance their independence. Programming helps individuals learn and practice daily living activities such as hygiene skills, light meal preparation, domestic tasks, self-medication skills, and money management.

COMMUNITY INCLUSION

Opportunities for participating in our community are an integral component of the services we offer. Individuals may attend a day program and are encouraged to attend social mixers, dances, community fairs, and other local events. We also take interested residents to movies, shopping centers, restaurants, beauty salons, banks, the library, and other community locations.

STAFF

Our staff receives specialized training to work with and meet the social, psychological, medical, developmental, educational, and vocational needs of the individuals who call this their home.



NURSING

Nursing services are available 24 hours a day and include:
